TRIBUTE TO EDDIE ADAMIC

1930—2023



Edward Anthony Adamic died on December 15th, 2023 after a long illness, and after a very long and successful career as a musician and polka promoter. He was born in Windsor Ontario on November 4, 1930, and as a child learned to love Slovenian folk music from his Slovenian parents. As a very talented accordion player, by the age of 14 he was performing in Slovenian, Croatian, and German ensembles. He bought Cleveland-style music records and listened to Slovenian radio shows, and he often visited Cleveland where he met and became friends with all the polka legends: Frankie Yankovic, Johnny Pecon, Johnny Vadnal, Eddie Habat, Kenny Bass, and many more. One of his great friends, Art Perko wrote Adamic's Polka in his honor. To add to his musical expertise, he also learned to play the button box at the behest of wife Fran's uncle. In the 1940s, he became Detroit and Windsor's best-known performer of Cleveland style polka music, and he entertained at events and festivals throughout the Great Lakes area.

Eddie's first big break in his music career came in 1948 when he joined the Stan Krainz Band. He took over as bandleader from 1952 to 1965, the heyday of polka music, playing for Windsor's lively Slovenian community and Slovenian Homes in Detroit. After he moved to Detroit, he played with bands led by Ronnie Dodich and Dennis Tatomir, but in 1975 he started his own band again. He appeared on television and radio shows; he performed in Michigan, Ohio, Wisconsin, and Canada. He also hosted tours to Slovenia, the Caribbean, Hawaii, and Spain. He has made five music recordings with various performers, such as an album in 1981 with Klancnik Brothers.


Eddie was a lifelong member of the Slovene National Benefit Society (SNPJ). He was inducted into the Michigan Polka Music Hall of Fame in 1982, and he was a founding member of the National Cleveland-Style Polka Hall of Fame and Museum. This information was taken from the page in the National Cleveland-Style Polka Hall of Fame book when Eddie received a Lifetime Achievement Award in 2013.

Upon the death of Frank Feil, Eddie was asked to join the Good Times Band and he played with them for about four years. For over twenty years, Eddie served as President of the Slovene American Club (SAC) of Michigan. He was very proud of his Slovenian heritage, and was dedicated to preserving the Slovenian music. He was always on hand as a leader/member of the SAC Button Box/Accordion club, joining in on the Thursday night practice and jam sessions. He encouraged others to join as well, and was always very welcoming to new members. Eddie was a true gentleman.

He was predeceased by his wife of 65 years, Frances, who was always by his side helping him during his duties as President of the SAC. He was also predeceased by his beautiful daughter Barbara, for whom he wrote the lovely Barbara Ann Waltz. He is survived by Barb's husband Bruce Baloh and their children, B.J. and Brandy; and his son Robert (Karen) Adamic and their children Nicole, Michelle, and Steven, and one great-granddaughter. He was also predeceased by one brother, William Adamic. As a tribute to Eddie at his private funeral, the current President of the Slovene American Club, Herb Schroeder, was asked to play Adamic's Polka and the Barbara Ann Waltz.

To honor Eddie Adamic, a man who was loved by so many musicians, friends, and polka family, the Slovene American Club is holding a Celebration of Life music event, and all are invited to come and share in this tribute. Be sure to RSVP to Ken or Mike so that we have an accurate food count.



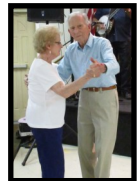
